Government Relations Committee Report



The 442nd session of the Maryland General Assembly convened on Tuesday, January 13, under conditions never before seen. The Senate Chamber has been divided up into tiny plexiglass cubicles for each Senator. The House "floor" is spread out over several spaces in the Statehouse, to allow for social distancing when floor votes are required. Hearings, debates, and votes, at least initially, will be conducted remotely. But for the first time, virtually all proceedings will be live-streamed for public viewing. The legislative buildings are, for the most

part, closed to the public until further notice. The public may still testify on bills, but oral and written testimony will be digital.

Another huge change is that for the first time since 1970, the General Assembly will convene without the towering presence of former Senate President Thomas V. Mike Miller, who succumbed, at 78, to prostate cancer on January 15. He was the longest serving state senate president in the nation, and a great friend to Maryland horse people.

The Horse Council's Government Relations Committee conducts one of the most important missions of the Council: representing our members in the halls of government. In this column, we will report on

the bills that have been introduced in Annapolis as of this writing; and,
some of the recent federal COVID relief legislation that may affect the equestrian community and the horse industry.

A number of bills were "pre-filed" before the session convened; more can and will be introduced until early March (unless there is an early COVID-related adjournment as there was last year). In a typical year, the legislature will consider as many as 3000 bills in its three month session.

Bills of possible interest:

ANIMAL WELFARE

UNATTENDED DOGS (HB 81/SB 122). Making it a misdemeanor to leave a dog outside and unattended for longer than 30 minutes without access to "continuous suitable shelter" during extreme weather conditions (over 90 degrees and below 32 degrees). The bill makes an exception for dogs that are lawfully and actively engaged in hunting, livestock herding, sledding, sporting or training.

TRAINING FOR ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS (HB 281/SB

159). Requiring new Humane Society and Animal Control officers to receive 80 hours of training in animal care within the first 12 months of their employment, and existing officers to receive 6 hours of training.

ORGANIZED WILDLIFE KILLING CONTESTS (HB 293/SB

200). Making it a finable offense to "sponsor, conduct, or participate in a contest organized in the state that has the objective of killing a coyote, fox, or raccoon for prizes or monetary rewards." No-kill fox chasing would not qualify. Also exempts "killing coyotes, foxes, or raccoons on property of the landowner, provided that the killing is not part of an organized contest" as well as "lawful dog training or dog performance competitions."

ANIMAL SHELTER EUTHANASIA PROTOCOL (HB 381).

Imposing a protocol to be followed by an animal shelter before it euthanizes an animal; requiring animal shelters to take "reasonable steps to achieve a 90 percent save rate"; and generally requiring animal shelters to exhaust all other options before euthanasia. Excludes "animals experiencing irremediable physical suffering."

EQUINE ASSISTED LEARNING AND THERAPY

THERAPY HORSE DEFINITION (SB 284). Defining "therapy horse" for purposes of the Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program as "a horse determined appropriate for interactions with veterans by a stable licensed by the state that . . . is a Professional Association for Therapeutic Horsemanship, International (PATH, Inc.) premier accredited member center; or has Equine Assisted Growth and Learning Association (EAGALA) certified professionals who provide services to veterans."

NATURAL RESOURCES AND HUNTING

RIGHT TO HUNT (SB 318). Declaring that the General Assembly intends to preserve "a right to hunt" subject to restrictions as may be imposed by law. Includes findings that hunting is an important part of Maryland's economy and contributes to wildlife and natural resource conservation.

SUNDAY HUNTING QUEEN ANNE'S (HB 225). Permitting Sunday hunting in Queen Anne's County for any game bird or game mammal during the open season for that game bird or game mammal. Private land only.

ing in Talbot County, for deer, on every Sunday from first Sunday in October to the second Sunday in January. Includes public and private land. Also permitting Sunday hunting on one Sunday of the spring turkey season if participating in a junior hunt.

SUNDAY HUNTING CALVERT (SB 356). Permitting Sunday hunting in Calvert County on "each Sunday of the game bird and game mammal seasons." Includes public and private land.

TAX CREDIT FOR DEER DONATION (HB 7). Expanding eligibility for a State income tax credit for deer donation expenses to include expenses incurred by an individual who hunts and harvests an antlerless deer in Montgomery County and who donates the deer carcass to the Montgomery County deer donation program.

New Federal COVID Relief Measures

After many months of debate in Congress, a new round of federal COVID relief measures became law on December 27 as part of a larger federal spending bill. This will allow more financial assistance to first time (those who did not receive a PPP loan before August 8, 2020) and "second draw" applicants, with a special focus on small businesses. "Second draw" applicants are those who previously received a PPP loan and will have used all the proceeds of the first loan before the second draw loan is disbursed.

To be eligible for a second draw PPP loan, a business must have been

eligible for the first round of the PPP, or be an independent contractor, self-employed individual, sole proprietor, nonprofit organization, veteran's organization, Tribal business concern, housing cooperative, small agricultural cooperative, eligible 501(c)(6) organization, or eligible non-profit news organization that:

- Has 300 or fewer employees;
- Has used or will use the full amount of its original PPP loan, if applicable; and
- Demonstrates at least a 25% reduction in gross receipts, calculated based upon first, second or third quarters of 2020 as compared to 2019.

The types of forgivable expenses permitted under the PPP (i.e., payroll costs, mortgage, rent, and utility payments), have been expanded to include certain other operations expenditures, property damage costs, supplier costs, and worker protection expenditures, including personal protective equipment to comply with COVID-19 federal health and safety guidelines, incurred during the covered period. The maximum loan amount in most cases is \$2,000,000, based on average monthly payroll. Independent contractors, sole proprietors the self-employed and others who do not issue a structured payroll and who file a Schedule F have a special method for calculating the loan amount. The lending institutions who provide the forgivable loans will now include more small lenders such as credit unions and, notably, farm credit institutions. Applications are open through March 31, 2021.

The Act also makes clear that business expenses paid with forgiven PPP loans are tax-deductible.

MHIB Announces Grant Winners

This year, the Maryland Horse Industry Board has awarded \$30,000 in grants to 33 organizations and equestrian operations. The grants committee selected projects from a pool of 41 applicants. Funding for the MHIB annual grants comes from the Maryland Feed Fund, which collects \$6 on every ton of horse feed sold in the state. The Feed Fund was established in 2002 allowing MHIB to award nearly \$600,000 in grants to over 400 projects thus far.

Several of this year's grants were awarded to pandemic-related projects, including funding for virtual learning kits, videos being produced by equine educational programs, and financial aid given to replenish a hay/grain bank that helped licensed stables during the pandemic. Other projects are related to industry requests from the 2019 Maryland Horse Forum, therapeutic riding programs, trail riding, ambulance rescue initiatives, and help for diverse equestrian disciplines like Western riding, pony breeding, and retired racehorses.

Project proposals were evaluated based on their value to the industry, degree of industry promotion, size and scope of activity, financial need, potential for matching funds, benefits, and overall quality of the written presentation. Grants are capped at \$3,000 in order to award funds to as many groups as possible. Eligible projects should have a completion date no later than June 30, 2021. Grant recipients are required to file a project report with the Board detailing how the money was used.

Bruton Street Wins in Ireland

While the steeplechase community was still buzzing over champion trainer Jonathan Sheppard's announcement of his retirement while campaigning a string of horses in Ireland, it was the partners of Bruton Street V that found themselves in the winner's circle at the Leopardstown Christmas Festival in Dublin, Ireland, on December 26.

Bruton Street V is the European arm of Bruton Street-US, the 2020 National Steeplechase Association champion owner. Partners in Bruton Street include Mike Hankin, Charlie Fenwick, Charlie Noell, Ben Griswold and others. Their five-year-old French-bred gelding Franco De Port ran away to a 4 ½ length upset in the Racing Post Novice Chase. Bryan Cooper was in the irons for trainer Willie Mullins.

Trainer Barred from Racing in Maryland and Other States

On Saturday, January 9, the New York Racing Association barred trainer Eric Guillot from racing on its circuit for changing the name of one of his horses to a racial slur and taunting African American analyst Ken Rudulph, who works for the horse racing network TVG.

According to the *New York Times*, the owners of the horse in question at the time were unaware of the name change and have since

fired Guillot as their trainer. Its new owner, Lawrence Roman stated, "We don't want racism in this sport." He has since changed the horse's name to Respect For All.

The Stronach Group, which owns the tracks here in Maryland, has also banned Guillot from racing horses at their tracks.

IHSA Cancels 2021 Postseason

The Intercollegiate Horse Shows Association board of directors has decided to cancel the 2021 IHSA postseason, which includes the Hunter Seat Zone Finals, Western Semi-Finals and the National Championship Horse Show due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act On December 22, 2020, Alan Foreman,

On December 22, 2020, Alan Foreman, Chairman of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, issued the following statement on the recent passage of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act on behalf of THA:

Statement on Passage of

"The passage of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act is the culmination of a collec-

tive effort of likedminded industry organizations who fostered compromises in an effort to achieve uniform and necessary mandated medication, testing and safety standards to protect the health, safety and welfare of our horses and maintain the integrity of our sport above reproach. We have quietly, but forcefully,

participated in this effort, and appreciate that we had the ability to participate at the congressional level through Majority Leader McConnell and Congressmen Barr, Tonko and Pallone. Although the bill is not perfect and has caused some concerns that we understand, it is clear that this new paradigm for the industry is necessary if we are serious about the future of our sport. We are particularly pleased that the original bill was expanded to mandate safety and welfare standards for our horses as we have been doing in the Mid-Atlantic region, and a better-defined role for USADA that speaks to their strengths and our needs.

As we've said previously, we intend to roll up our sleeves and collaborate with our industry partners and the new Authority to achieve a seamless transition. While change is never easy and valid concerns must be addressed and resolved, we are at a critical time for our industry. The enactment of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act provides us with a unique opportunity to change the image of our sport and engender confidence in the future."







According to champion international driver Tracey Morgan, the sport of Combined Driving is "a sport for all ages," however, it is mostly dominated by drivers in their late 30s and early 40s. Morgan herself, did not start driving until later in life after having competed in Eventing and Dressage. "Driving is great for those equestrians who want to continue doing something fun but may not want to jump all the big jumps anymore," she said.

So how is it then that the top single pony driver in the country for the 2020 season is only 16 years old!

Why Driving?

Riley Wiltison was introduced to the sport of Driving by neighbor Cynthia Doll while he was in 4-H riding her ponies. "Cynthia also had driving ponies and asked me if I wanted to go for a ride on the back of the carriage," Wiltison said. "I really liked it so she taught me to drive and let me start driving one of her Welsh ponies, Dollhouse Shenanigans."

Just like that, Wiltison was hooked. By the time he was nine years old, Wiltison was entered in his first official Combined Driving competition, a Horse Driving Test (HDT) at the Teddy Bear Picnic, hosted by the Brandywine Driving Club. A HDT has a shorter marathon course than the traditional Combined Driving Event (CDE) competitions. "I was only nine years old so I wasn't old enough to do a recognized event like an American Driving Society (ADS) or United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) one. Cynthia had to convince the organizers to let me do the marathon. I was really slow compared to now, but it was a lot of fun," he remarked.

Combined Driving is a three-phase competition similar to Eventing in that it starts with dressage, then a cross-country type phase called the marathon, and then finish with cones, which would be similar to show jumping. However, unlike Eventing which is ridden, in Combined Driving, the competitor is driving a cart behind that horse. Wiltison explained that there are four levels to Combined Driving:

Maryland Youth

Tops National Driving Championship

Training, Preliminary, Intermediate and Advanced. "Marathon is my favorite because it is cross-country through obstacles as fast as you can go," he said.

Getting Serious

Morgan met Wiltison and his family early in his driving career when she saw him driving at a local event. "He has the ability to focus very well," she said adding, "He is above average in his ability to focus on the animal and the challenges of the sport." Being impressed by his advanced skills at such an early age, she offered to take him on as a student.

Now, Wiltison drives year-round with Morgan. "I take my ponies to her house in Beallsville for lessons and training, except for the winter when I train with her at the Grand Oaks Resort in Weirsdale, FL," he explained. Wiltison and his family head to Florida every winter to keep up with the Combined Driving scene. "I have been in Florida for the past five winters. There are a lot of drivers and competitions here and it is an amazing training facility," he added.

Morgan explained that here in the United States, the "best venues with the most competitive entries" are in the Ocala region of Florida from January to March. The season takes a bit of a break in the summer when the footing is hard and the weather is hot before picking back up again in the Mid-Atlantic area in the fall. "Riley's parents are so very supportive," she said. "It's a lot of work but they all enjoy it."

Morgan added, "Riley is a very dedicated kid. He is very serious about the sport but in the right kind of way."

Championship Year

This past season, Wiltison continued to drive his 12-year-old, 14.2H Connemara pony, Willow's Aslan. The pair has won championship honors for the past three seasons. In 2018, they won the American Driving Society National Championship at Preliminary and in 2019, they won ADS's National Championship at Intermediate. He was just 14 years old when he won his first National Championship!

This past season, the pair earned the 2020 USEF Champion Horse of the Year title in the Combined Driving Intermediate Single Pony division. "We are so excited!" said Wiltison's mom Billie. "He is one of a few junior drivers and the only junior to place. All others that placed below him are adults." Unlike many other USEF disciplines, in Combined Driving, there are no separate junior divisions. All ages of drivers compete together.

Wiltison said being able to compete at the Live Oak CDE was a highlight for him this past season. "Live Oak is the biggest CDE in the US. They only have Intermediate and Advanced levels and the obstacles are very technical so 2020 was the first time I was ready for this competition." He placed third overall and were the only ones in the division to go double clear in the cones phase. "That means we had no time faults and no balls knocked down," he explained.

Wiltison's scores over the past few years have already made him eligible for the World Championships. Being able to represent the US at the World Championships is certainly a goal of Wiltison's, as is driving a team of four-in-hand Dartmoor ponies.

Future Endevors

Wiltison seems to already be on his way to achieving both goals as he recently started competing in the Pairs Pony divisions with two Dartmoor ponies, Lizwell's Gambling Queen ("Maude") and Fiddlemarker's Bottle Rocket ("Rocket"). In addition, he also drives Morgan's Singletree Poker Alice ("Lottie"). "Maude and Rocket do the dressage and cones phases. And then Rocket and Lottie do the marathon phase," Wiltison explained.

Maude is 25 years old and incredibly experienced as she has already earned nine USEF National Championships and been to four World Championships with Morgan. Owend by Susan Deutermann, Maude is the senior member of the team, and helps teach the younger 14-year-old Rocket, owned by Lory Eigme, and six-year-old Lottie. "You often need the knowledge of the older mare to help teach the younger ones," Morgan stated.

Wiltison competed the Dartmoor ponies at the USEF National Championship for Preliminary Pair Pony at the end of January. Results from the CDE held at the Grand Oaks Resort in Florida were unavailable at the time this article when to press so check equiery.com for results!

"Not all single drivers make good pairs drivers," Morgan said. "But as soon as he tried it, I knew he'd be good at it. He's just very smooth with the ponies." She added, "Riley is a shining start for young riders and I hope more young people read this article and decide they want to try driving."

"It is challenging being a junior in this sport and sometimes it would be nice to compete against other juniors, but there are very few junior drivers, and none currently driving in my division with the single or pair," Wiltison said. "My parents joke that most of my competitors have been driving longer than I have been alive but it is fun when I beat the adults, and they don't seem to mind... well some do!" he said with a laugh.



Hilltop Farm's Riverman, who died in 2020, still found himself as the USEF's Eventing Sire of the Year for the sixth time. He has also earned the reserve champion honors in this category three times. Riverman was also ranked seventh on the USEF's Hunter Breeding Sire list for 2020.



Sixteen year old Bailey Riemer (originally from Jordon, WY and now working at Dr. Mike Odian's farm) is a fourth generation draft horse driver who recently won big at the World Percheron Congress, held in Iowa last October. Riemer was named the Overall Senior Youth Showman 15 to 18 Year Old at the finals, which are held every four years in Canada and the US. In addition she earned the World Champion Junior Driver titles in Senior Junior Driver Cart, Senior Junior Driver Team and Junior Decorating classes. She also finished second in the Junior Showmanship class and sixth place in the Horse Judging class.



Maryland was represented by four riders this past season in the 2020 US Eventing Association year-end championships. At the Novice level, Paige Ansaldi of Ellicott City was the top Intercollegiate Rider and top Young Adult Rider. Ansaldi competes for the University of Maryland's Eventing Team. Carlin Keefe of Sandy Spring rode two horses to earn the Training Junior Rider championship. She is pictured above riding Flintstar, owned by her mother Rumsey Keefe and grandmother Trish Gilbert. At the Preliminary level, sister Ryan Keefe earned the Intercollegiate Rider title. And finally, Ema Klugman of Clarksburg was named the 2020 USEA Classic Series champion for her scores at the Waredaca Classic 3Day.





The National Steeplechase Association, with offices in Fair Hill, has recently hired **Emery Jones Taylor** (West Grove, PA) as its new General Manager and **Harper McVey** (Hockessin, DE) in the role of Executive Secretary. They replace Pete McGivney and Nancy Dougherty who both recently retired.

MARYLAND WILL MISS...

Charles C. "Cuppy" Fenwick died on December 16, 2020. He was 96. Fenwick was born and raised in the Glyndon area and spent his entire life on the family's farm. He was the director of the Maryland Hunt Cup for 30 years, and three of his five children are active in the steeplechase community as well: Charles C. Fenwick, Jr., and H. Bruce Fenwick are both National Steeplechase Association horsemen, and Peter R. Fenwick is a member of NSA's Board of Directors. Fenwick himself never was a steeplechase jockey, but in addition to supporting the Maryland Hunt Cup, he was a member of the Green Spring Valley Hounds.

Fenwick attended Princeton University after graduating from the Gilman School in 1942. He was at Princeton only for a year before enlisting in the U.S. Army infantry to serve during World War II. He was part of the Normandy landing in September 1944. He earned a Bronze Star for his role in the Battle of the Bulge, laying strategic mines during the Christmas Eve fighting as part of the Anti-Tank Company, 407th Infantry.

After returning from the war, Fenwick married Rosalie Bruce and the couple had four sons. After their divorce, he married Elizabeth White and they have one son together.

Fenwick was a clerk with the U.S. Steamship Line for the port of Baltimore before later co-founding Fenwick, Michaels and Downes, which is the predecessor of Riggs, Counselman, Michaels and Downes, an insurance advisory firm. He also sold Volkswagen cars out of his first dealership, Towson Valley Motors, starting in 1962. The dealership grew quickly to include several imports and continues today as Valley Motors in Hunt Valley.

Mary Wanamaker "Minnie" Watriss of Butler died on December 18 at the age of 89. She was born in Philadelphia, PA, but was raised in

California and New York. She graduated from the Foxcroft School and then Bennett Junior College before moving to Glyndon in 1952, the year she married C.A. Porter Hopkins, a Republican state senator representing Baltimore County. The two were later divorced. She later married H. Robertson Fenwick, who died in 1976 and James B. Watriss, who died in 1998.

Watriss was a foxhunter and a patron of steeplechase racing as well as Ladew Topiary Gardens. She was a partner in Arcadia Stables, co-owned with Andre Brewster and Peyton "Skip" Cochran, Jr. Some of their winning horses, trained by Jack Fisher, included Bubble Economy and Footlights. Watriss was known for her fabulous pre-race tailgates and generous hospitality.

Southern Maryland Quarter Horse Association member **Kathleen Easter-Knott** died on December 28, 2020 at the age of 58. She had been a resident of Mechanicsville for the past 17 years and was the owner of It's-A-Celebration event planning. Previously, she had been employed by NAVFAC as the fleet manager for transportation at the Navy Yard. Easter-Knott was also a youth advisor and board member for SMQHA.

Naomi Scharf Manders died on January 4 at her home in Potomac. She was 82. Born in Los Angeles, CA, Manders moved East to attend Manhattanville College in New York where she earned a BA degree. Manders was a Potomac Hunt Club member, long known as a force to be reckoned with in Montgomery County for her leadership in building and maintaining the county's natural multi-use trail systems. From 1986 to 1992, she served as President of the Potomac Bridle and Hiking Trails Association and the Montgomery County Coordinator for Trail Riders of Today (TROT).

Manders successfully negotiated many public bridle path easements to form the Travilah Loop, a four-mile trail around Potomac com-

posed of thirteen participating subdivisions linking stables and parklands to preserve an equestrian presence in suburbia. This led to a job with Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning as a Trail Planner for the Department of Park Planning and Development. There she became instrumental in setting up the Natural Surface Trails Program and helped to develop the trails in Rachael Carson Park, Muddy Branch Park, Schaefer Farm Park, and Northwest Branch.

After retiring from MNCPPC, Manders helped to develop Dry Seneca Creek Trail and Breezy Loop Trail, and was a critical advocate for the recently approved development of the Seneca Greenway. She was awarded the Maryland Horse Council's Pumphrey Memorial Award for her efforts in preserving Montgomery County's trail systems.

Frank Patterson Wright of Lutherville died on January 10 at the age of 95. He was born in Mardela Springs, and as an adult worked his way up the ranks of Avis Truck Rental, becoming Vice President in charge of the Mid Atlantic and Southern East Coast regions. In 1976, he bought two franchises from Avis and formed York Truck Rental which operated in Pennsylvania. After selling the business in 1985, Wright retired.

In 1968, he and his wife Virginia Howard Wright bought a farm that they named Huntingfields. It took them five years to renovate the farm before they could move in. There he and Ginny started breeding Thoroughbreds in 1979 and then started racing their homebreds starting in 1982. At the peak of their operation, they had over 50 horses. Big winners included Valay Maid, Lady Sabelia, Blue Sky Princess, Gold Rolls and Inner Harbour.

Wright served on the boards of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association and Maryland Million, Ltd.


