



Letter from the **Publisher**

What an Incredible Journey! By Neil Agate, MHC President



As this will be my last MHC Publisher's letter as President of the Maryland Horse Council, I hope you will indulge me with a short trip down memory lane to see the incredible progress MHC has made over the last few years.

The Maryland Horse Council has always been a flourishing and influential organization within the state and has had many successes legislatively and in helping to solidify and build the horse community. When I first got involved with

the organization almost 10 years ago, we were very much a volunteer run organization with a part-time management company keeping the back office moving along. About five years ago, three separate topics started to be discussed within MHC. All of them were significant and I remember thinking that if any one of them came to fruition it would be good for MHC and the horse community in general.

Those discussions were 1) create a state wide aftercare program to stem the shipping of unwanted horses to slaughter, 2) whether the MHC should get into the publishing business with either a new newsletter or acquiring *The Equiery*, and 3) the hiring of a full-time Executive Director.

Ironically the third of these was the one we focused most of our attention on and yet it was the first two of these discussions that have been the most successful. Despite the fact that we have not been able to fully execute on the third, hiring an Executive Director is still on our radar. MHC has seen significant growth in size and influence during this time, and a professional Executive Director will no doubt be needed in the not so distant future to keep all the moving parts working efficiently and effectively.

The purchase and integration of The Equiery has been a great success and promises to deliver dividends to the MHC community for years to come. We continue to integrate MHC's missions and messages into The Equiery while maintaining the high quality of content that has made The Equiery a mainstay in all parts of Maryland's equestrian community. The staff, Katherine Rizzo (Editor-in-Chief), Tracy McKenna (Associate Publisher), Emily Nessel (Marketing Coordinator) and Carolyn Del Grosso (Bookkeeping) have done an incredible job not only maintaining the high quality of the magazine but also making sure that we keep pushing forward on all aspects of the publication.

The whole team dug in when in 2018, our long-time printer announced with very short notice that they were going out of business and we were faced with finding a new printer within 30 days. Not only did we find a new printer, but in the process we selected one (Evergreen Printing) that uses new technology allowing us to upgrade the print and paper quality to deliver a higher quality publication than the newsprint we had previously been printed on.

Behind the scenes, we have recently moved to an all-in-one online publishing system (Magazine Manager) that allows us to keep all of our information within the same system for advertisers, ads and editorial content. While this gives us a great advantage in increased efficiency, like all new systems, it required a lot of effort, especially for Katherine who now does all of the layout on the new system and Tracy, whose whole ad sales workflow process has changed.

While our main focus for the foreseeable future will be on the print publication, like everyone in the publishing business, we have been spending a lot of time on integrating our online presence. Recently we've published new online classifieds and an all new online events calendar on equiery.com. Over the coming months we'll be working on a number of online directories, further integration of our print content to our online sites, and a new initiative that will allow us to boost our print advertisers reach through an exciting new online advertising program.

I'd like to publicly acknowledge the great work that Emily Nessel has done in not only holding many parts of The Equiery together, but also stepping up and taking over the role of MHC Membership Coordinator, where she has helped streamline the whole membership process and initiated several newsletters that allow us to keep our membership and the community informed on everything that is going on in our vibrant community.

Finally we all know that operations like MHC/Equiery can't run successfully without a good financial base and for that we can thank Carolyn Del Grosso who makes sure that all the right bills are sent out and our finances are in good shape. In addition, I want to thank Carolyn for keeping the doors open for the last 12+ months by physically going into the office every day during this pandemic to make sure nothing fell through the cracks.

The formation and growth of the Maryland Equine Transition Service (METS) over the last four years has been nothing short of amazing. What started as an unfunded idea to slow the transportation of unwanted horses to slaughter in Mexico and Canada has become an extremely

effective part of Maryland's aftercare and rescue communities and has helped transition over 200 horses in a little over three years. We were fortunate to have received funding through the Right Horse Initiative/ Arnall Family Foundation for the first three years of METS' existence and as a testament to the success of the program, we are honored to have received new support from Maryland's own Gentle Giants Draft Horse Rescue that will sustain us into the future.

METS Receives Grant from Gentle Giants (edited press release)

The Maryland Horse Council Foundation, Inc., is pleased to announce that it has received a generous grant from Gentle Giants Draft Horse Rescue (Gentle Giants) to fund the Maryland Equine Transition Service (METS) program. Gentle Giants will be the primary financial supporter of METS while the grant is in effect.

METS is a central component of the equine aftercare network in Maryland. It is a re-homing program that works on behalf of horses in need and matches the right owner to the right horse. METS advises owners on transition options, assesses horses for re-homing suitability, and distributes information about the horses in need through its expansive equestrian network. It has been in operation for three years and, in that time, has re-homed over 200 horses in need.

"We are all so proud of what the METS team have been able to accomplish in three short years but even more excited to see where we as a community can take the program in the future with support of great organizations like

USEF Changes Masks Rule

As of May 17, the USEF has updated its protocols regarding facemasks at all USEF-licensed competitions due to updated CDC recommendations. The change states that those who are fully vaccinated no longer need to wear facemasks at USEF-licensed competitions when outdoors and at least six feet away from other individuals (except those within the same immediate household). USEF also states that if individuals enter an area that is fully or partially indoors, masks must be worn and social distance is required. In addition, USEF reminds all participants that local COVID-19 rules still apply, thus if a state or county still requires facemasks, then the competition must do so as well.

Chicoteague Pony Swim Canceled

The Chicoteague Island Volunteer Fire Department decided to cancel this year's pony swim and live auction due to the ongoing CO-VID-19 pandemic. State restrictions on gatherings were behind the organizers' decision to cancel the July event.

Barn Fire in Montgomery County

The cause of a barn fire that occurred on May 12 in Montgomery County is still under investigation. The fire caused more than \$2 million in damages at a Peach Tree Road farm. The fire was mainly located in a large barn containing round hay bales but had also spread to two attached structures and nearby fuel tanks. No animals or people were hurt in the fire.

WIHS Stays at Tryon and Morven Park for 2021

The Washington International Horse Show will be held at the Tryon International Equestrian Center (NC) again this year. The WIHS Regional Horse Show and USHJA Zone 3 Championship return to Morven Park International Equestrian Center (VA).

WIHS stated that it has moved to Tryon for the second year in a row due to COVID-19 restrictions still in place for the Capital One Arena in Washington, DC. As of press, there was no official comment on why the WIHS Regional show has moved away from the Prince George's Equestrian Center for the second year in a row. Last year, it was moved to Morven Park due to COVID-19 restrictions at PGEC.

Rosecroft Reopens to the Public

On April 30, Rosecroft Raceway was given approval by Prince George's County to reopen to the public. Beginning on May 1, the track was allowed to host up to 300 spectators daily, in addition to Maryland Racing Commission licensees affiliated with live racing, for both simulcasting and live racing. Live racing will take place at Rosecroft on Wednesdays and Sundays with simulcasting available Wednesday through Sunday each week.

Baltimore Mounted Unit Saved

Last spring, funding for the Baltimore Police Department's mounted unit was cut by the City Coun-

cil amid protests and calls for reduced police spending. However, behind the scenes, then-Mayor Jack Young moved the unit from the Police Department to the Recreation and Parks Department, thus saving the unit.

Unfortunately, according to *Baltimore Brew*, protesters are still angry with the money spent on BPD with current Mayor Brandon Scott stating it will take more than one fiscal year to cut the BPD funding as he promised during his campaign. Scott has recently proposed a 5% increase in the BPD budget. Scott is however, moving the mounted unit budget from BPD to

Recreation and Parks and is dedicating the unit "exclusively" to community relations.

"The program is now entirely focused on community engagement exclusively," stated Deputy Director of Communications Stefanie Mavronis. According to Lindsey Eldrige, a spokeswoman for BPD, four officers, a sergeant and the three remaining horses will be assigned to the Community and Youth Division.

The unit is currently housed at the B&O Railroad Museum where the unit will work with the museum on a variety of youth-focused programs.

Laurel Park to Close Temporarily

Due to renovations of the track surface at Laurel Park, horsemen have been asked to leave Laurel immediately after the Preakness Stakes on May 15. Officials from the Mary-

land Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association held a Zoom meeting on April 30 at which Aidan Butler of 1/ST Racing stated the track may remain closed through July 1. Butler is the Chief Operating Officer for 1/ST Racing and is overseeing the track resurfacing project at Laurel Park.

MTHA Executive Secretary David Richardson stated during the meeting that as many as 140 temporary stalls will be set up at Pimlico immediately after the Preakness. MTHA is also in discussions with the Maryland State Fair officials about possibly using stalls at Timonium, which currently has 580 stalls.

Butler added that during the closure, other projects at Laurel Park will also be addressed, such as eradicating a rat infestation on the backside.

MD TB Career Program Restarts

After a one-year hiatus due to the CO-VID-19 pandemic, the Maryland Horse Industry Foundation's Maryland Thoroughbred Career Program is back for 2021 with five participants from across the United States: Charles Churchill (Louisville, KY), Ashlee Marcy (Hanover, MD), Sophie O'Connor (Shorewood, WI), Cayla Reeder (Kearneysville, WV) and Zaharia A. Selman (Conyers, GA). During the five day program, participants tour several Thoroughbred-related sites in Maryland learning about all aspects of the industry. Graduates of the program are eligible to apply for Career Development Funds, one-time funding that can be used to further career pursuits within two years after the program ends.

On April 26, 16-year-old Riley Wiltison of Oakland, MD, added yet another USEF Combined Driving title to his name. Wiltison, who was featured on the cover of our February 2021 issue, won the USEF Intermediate Single Pony Combined Driving National Championship at the Katydid CDE in Mill Spring, NC, driving Willow's Aslan.

The pair earned a 56.28 in dressage with Wiltison stating, "I was very happy with him. He performed well and listened to me." They then moved into the lead after winning the marathon phase with an 81.63. After a rest day, Wiltison and Willow's Aslan went double clear in cones to finish on a score of 137.91 penalty points and earn the National Championship title.



tors and volunteers into Baltimore City, stemmed from a meeting Dahn had with Ashley Valis, now Executive Director of Strategic Initiatives and Community Engagement at UMB but at the time was representing the Governor's Office. The program filled with a waitlist on the first day of registration! "We hope to do something like this again in the fall."

For their continuous efforts to bring horsemanship into Baltimore's city communities, City Ranch was named a Maryland Outdoor Ambassador by Governor Hogan on May 5. Naming Maryland Outdoor Recreation Ambassadors was a recommendation of the Maryland Outdoor Recreation Economic (MORE) Commission, which was established by Hogan in 2017. As part of the program, ambassadors continue working to enhance the state's status as a leading destination for outdoor recreation.





Maryland Youth Ema Klugman Earns Top Young Rider Award at Kentucky 5*

Just a few short years ago, Marylander Ema Klugman and her mother were in Lexington, KY, watching what was then called the Rolex Kentucky Three-Day Event. "It was crosscountry day and I looked at my mum and said, I don't want to compete at this level," Klugman remarked. Four years later, the Clarksburg event rider completed her first five-star event... the Land Rover Kentucky Three-Day Event.

Pony Club From Kenya to Seneca

Klugman was born in the U.S. to Australian parents, but learned to ride as a child in Nairobi, Kenya, where her mother, Jeni, was working with the World Bank. It was in Kenya that the entire Klugman family took part in riding at a local stable as well as becoming involved with pony club.

Klugman stated even though riding was a family affair while she was young, now only she and her mom still ride consistently. "My mum grew up riding in Australia and still does fitness riding for me," Klugman stated. "She's a huge help!"

Klugman has called the D.C. area home for all but the two years that she spent with her family in Nairobi. She became a U.S. citizen six months ago but is still close to her Australian roots, competing internationally as an Australian. "I've had a lot of support from the Australian Federation and plan to stay in the U.S. but compete as an Australian, at least for now," she explained, adding, "America is a great country for eventing. There [are] like five events within 30 minutes of my house."

Here in the U.S., Klugman joined Seneca Valley Pony Club, moving up the ranks to the highest level, the A-rating, and continues to be an active member. "Pony club played a huge role in getting me to this five-star," Klugman said. "All the foundations learned in pony club... like wrapping and conditioning... I used it all [at Kentucky]."

She said that Pony Club "makes you really learn how to do things properly" and that she "learned to explain why you do things, not just how to do them." She added that "knowing the why" is a must for anyone aspiring to be a trainer.

A 5^{*} Partner

Klugman has had many equine partners over the years but her first dive into the international levels of the sport has come with her current five-star horse Bendigo. Her family purchased Bendigo, a Trakehner/Thoroughbred cross, eight years ago as an 11-year-old. Bendigo had done some show jumping but no eventing. That same year, she entered him in his first event, **www.equiery.com** | 800-244-9580 the Maryland Horse Trials at Loch Moy Farm where they finished sixth in Junior Novice.

Klugman affectionately remarked that "Ben" is not a natural eventer in terms of his abilities. "He's not a good mover. Does not have an impressive gallop or jump. But he's extremely intelligent," she said, adding that Ben is a quick study and he retains information well, both qualities that make a great event horse. "He has a lot of heart and is brave and really tries," she said. "We know each other really well so we trust each other."

And trust is what got this pair around one of the hardest cross-country courses in the world.

A Kentucky Spring

Klugman had never intended to run Ben in a five-star but this spring things fell into place. "There was some push from the Australian team to compete at that level if I wanted to stay on their radar," Klugman said. "And [Ben has] just improved every year we've had him." In fact, the horse did his first CCI event in only his second year of eventing.

When they arrived in Kentucky this April, the 23-year-old Klugman and the 19-year-old horse settled into the Kentucky Horse Park on a sunny and warm Tuesday only to wake up on Wednesday morning to several inches of snow. "It was all kind of funny really," Klugman said with a chuckle.

The comedy seemed to continue on dressage day as Klugman reported, "We were tacking up Ben and my saddle pad fell off and landed in some muddy water... then my spur strap broke." Klugman's team quickly got a new pad and some new spur straps but the whole thing did "add a bit of stress to the day."

"We have a great team of people around us," Klugman said. "It's a huge amount of work to get through a weekend like that. Lots of behind the scenes work." After dressage, Klugman was sitting in 61st place with a score of 41.5%.

Cross-country day was rainy and boggy causing 15 riders, including some seasoned Olympians, to be eliminated on course. Klugman and Ben handled the weather as if the footing were perfect, jumping clean and adding only eight time faults to their dressage score. "He is incredibly honest and incredibly quick away from the jumps, which makes him fast on crosscountry," Klugman explained. The pair moved up to 31st place going into the final phase of competition.

After a brief hold in the final jog Sunday morning, the pair entered the main arena at the Kentucky Horse Park for show jumping that afternoon. "Ben normally excels in crosscountry and show jumping but I screwed up [in Kentucky]," she said. "I just let the atmosphere *continued...*

get to me and am a bit bummed. I learned that I need to go over my plan more than I did."

In the end, the pair finished in 33rd place and Klugman earned a special award for being the highest placed young rider. They were also the only current Maryland pair to complete the event. "Just to get through it was an accomplishment," she added. "It also showed me that I am capable to ride a cross-country course that is that hard. It reassures you that your training is actually working."

A Maryland Autumn

While Ben gets the next few months off, Klugman is focusing on the other horses in her barn, especially two promising young horses that she thinks will be her next five-star horses. "Bronte Beach is eight years old and just did her first Advanced," Klugman stated. "She is really talented and classy."The pair won the CCI3*-L at Virginia Horse Trials International last year and Klugman hopes to step up to the four-star level this year with her. "The goal is that she'll be my first Badminton or Burghley horse," she added.

Klugman's other young horse is RF Redfern, a seven-year-old that was bred for jumpers. "She's a machine!" Klugman said. "She's small in stature but has won eight out of 10 events so far." Klugman joked that with the pair of mares, "we have some bit of girl power going on!"

With Ben, Klugman said she will wait and see how he feels after his summer vacation. "He's done a huge amount for us so he can retire if needed but I know him so well. So if he feels good, I'll start working him towards the Maryland 5-Star."

Klugman will be attending George Washington Law School this August as she continues with her eventing career and training out of her family's Snowy River Farm.

The Importance of Trainers

When asked what is the biggest advice she has for other young riders looking to compete at the top levels of eventing, she said, "You need to have really good training from someone who knows what they are doing."

"I've never considered myself a natural rider," she added. "You have to have really good training to succeed at this level." For Klugman, that trainer was Packy McGaughan. "He got me to focus not on results, but on how to continue to improve." Klugman went on to say how he taught her the importance of how to ride precisely and correctly. "All the little things [Packy] would get after me about ... it all helped me get to the five-star level. If anyone has access to someone like Packy, they can get there too."

Klugman also pointed out that young riders should seek out trainers who have good records with training young riders. "I mean, just look at the entries at Kentucky this year... Daniel [Clasing], Matt [Flynn], Lillian [Heard] and Marilyn [Little] all rode with him."

Since McGaughan's death in March 2020, Klugman has been training with Marilyn Little and Hilary Moore Hebert. "Marilyn was a huge help to me all week [at Kentucky] helping me in general navigate the event," Klugman said.

In addition to proper training, Klugman says to be prepared "to work hard, be dedicated and try to make it work." She added, "This sport is incredibly difficult. Even when you are winning and going clean, you still need to work at it."



Did you know that Maryland is home to over 700 licensed stables? Many of those offer riding lessons to everyone from beginners to advanced riders. From pleasure riding to the competition ring, Maryland lesson barns have a lot to offer! But how do you know which barn is the right fit for you? Take a look at these tips on finding a suitable lesson barn and read *The Equiery's* full "Learn the Ride" guide at https://equiery.com/the-equierys-learn-to-ride-guide/

1. Stables licensed through the Maryland Horse Industry Board (Maryland Department of Agriculture) are inspected annually to ensure that the horse care and riding equipment meet certain minimum standards. MHIB licensing does not ensure the quality of instruction.

2. Maryland does not require instructors to be certified or licensed, however there are many national and international programs that offer teaching certifications. In addition, many colleges offer equine studies degrees which include certification programs or their equivalent. Please note, there are many outstanding instructors who hold no certification whatsoever.

3. One of the best ways to learn more about an instructor before signing up for a lesson program is to watch them teach a few lessons and use your own judgment.

4. Ask yourself the following questions to help narrow down your lesson stable search:

a. Are you looking for a stable that caters strictly to adults? Strictly children? Or a mix of both?

b. Do you know if you want to ride English or Western?

c. Do you want, generally, to ride for pleasure or do you have the goal of competing?

5. After calling a few lesson stables in your area to see if they may be the right fit, visit them in person and meet their staff, instructors, horses, etc. Be sure to call ahead to find out if there are specific times to visit. Some stables offer open houses and introductory lessons.





Session Wrap Up

The 2021 Session of the General Assembly is in the books – "one and done," as they say. Our column last month laid out the legislation on which the Maryland Horse Council was active and successful. This month, we summarize other bills that passed this year and that affect the horse community.

Animal Welfare

Testing Cosmetics on Animals: Sen. Clarence Lam and Del. Terri Hill sponsored legislation this year to prohibit testing cosmetics on

animals (SB 282/HB 611). Contrary to popular belief, there is no federal ban on testing cosmetics in animals – defined as any "live, nonhuman, vertebrate" – so the matter is left to the states. The new law makes it a misdemeanor for a cosmetics manufacturer to sell, in Maryland, any cosmetic that has been tested on animals, or any cosmetic that contains any ingredient that has been tested on animals, except when such testing is required by law. The only other states in the country that currently ban the sale of cosmetics tested on animals are California, Nevada, Illinois, and Virginia.

Land Use

Ag land preservation: Sen. Ronald Young sponsored legislation to set a goal of preserving 1,030,000 acres of productive agricultural land by 2030 through the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation, the Maryland GreenPrint Program, the Rural Legacy Program, and local land preservation programs (SB 692). The new law also allows acres preserved through the Maryland Environmental Trust and the Next Generation Farmland Acquisition Program to be counted toward the 1,030,000-acre goal.

Fair Hill Funding: Sen. Jason Gallion introduced legislation to appropriate \$1,300,000 from the annual budget for fiscal years 2023 through 2027 for the Fair Hill Improvement Fund (SB 919). The new law appropriates the money for operation and maintenance of the physical facilities within the Special Event Zone of the Fair Hill Natural Resource Management Area. The Special Event Zone is the newly designed and upgraded area that will be the venue for the Maryland 5 Star at Fair Hill three day event, as well as steeplechase events and other horse shows.

Thoroughbred Racing

Maryland-Bred Race Fund: Sen. Guy Guzzone introduced legislation to enlarge the Maryland-Bred Race Fund Advisory Committee to include a member recommended by the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (SB 533). The Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association is the trade association for Maryland Thoroughbred owners and trainers. The new law also clarifies that horses still qualify as Maryland-Breds if they are foaled in Maryland by a dam who later "dies, is permanently retired, or is certified by a veterinarian as unable to be bred," provide the dam "resided in the state for at least 6 months after the horse was foaled." Horses that race as Maryland-breds are eligible for additional purse money from the Maryland-bred Race Fund.

Sports Wagering: The General Assembly passed long-sought legislation to legalize betting on professional and college sports, including Thoroughbred racing, and to give sports wagering licenses to almost 100 mobile and brick-and-mortar applicants (HB 940). The Maryland Jockey Club and the Maryland State Fairgrounds are guaranteed licenses for Laurel, Pimlico, and Timonium. Legalized sports wagering is expected to generate \$18 million in revenue annually, the majority of which will be used for K-12 public education.

Other

Net Metering: Del. Luke Clippinger sponsored legislation this year to double the total state-wide amount of customer-generated electricity from renewable sources that can be sold back to the energy grid, a practice known as net metering (HB 569). Previous law limited the amount of customer-generated energy that could fed back into the Maryland power grid to 1,500 megawatts (MW), with each individual customer limited to 2 MW. The new law doubles the state-wide capacity limit to 3,000 MW, which will allow many more individual customers – such as horse farms and lesson programs-- to sell power to the grid. Energy sources that are eligible for net metering include solar, wind, biomass, micro combined heat and power, fuel cell, and certain types of hydroelectric.

Balloon Releases: Del. Wayne Hartman introduced legislation to make it a misdemeanor to intentionally release a balloon into the atmosphere, or to organize a "mass balloon release" (HB 391). The new law covers any "nonporous bag of tough and light material, generally latex or mylar, whether filled or unfilled." Downed balloons can be deadly to pets, livestock, and wildlife that ingest bits of the balloon material or the attached strings. Violations are subject to mandatory six months of community service or a \$100 dollar fine per release, or both.

Graham Equestrian Center: Del. Michelle Guyton secured \$100,000 in bond funding for the Graham Equestrian Center (GEC) in Gunpowder Falls State Park to build an indoor arena. GEC is a Horse Discovery Center and a lesson program, and it hosts numerous educational and other outreach events. Its charitable mission is "to educate the mind, improve the body and lift the spirits of local children and adults, regardless of income or (dis)ability, through the joy of horses." One reason for the new indoor arena is to increase the number of therapeutic equine activities.

Days End Farm Horse Rescue: The Howard County delegation secured \$500,000 in bond funding for Days End Farm Horse Rescue to acquire and repurpose the adjacent Lisbon firehouse. Days End's charitable mission is to rescue and rehabilitate suffering horses and to prevent abuse and neglect through education and community outreach. The renovations will include building an educational welcome center with interactive displays and converting an outbuilding into an equine rehabilitation medical suite.

REPORT FROM INDUSTRY PROFESSIONAL MEMBER, AHESAHMAHK DAHN OF CITY RANCH



City Ranch is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that brings horses to the children of Baltimore city, as well as offering youth, adult and therapeutic lessons at its Windsor Mill, MD location. This innovative program recognizes "that children need to be challenged and a comprehensive equestrian program in an urban setting can provide that."

"City Ranch has started a Capital Campaign because: 1) it's the

time, and 2) an unfortunate - but maybe fortunate - circumstance has arisen to drive this campaign effort," says Ahesahmahk Dahn, who founded the program with his wife, Jean.

Dahn added, "City Ranch has been at its current location as a boarder and lessee since 2006. The owner gave us two week's notice that the property would be put on the market. It was not a surprise to City Ranch that the owners wanted to sell the property. Casual conversation about selling and City Ranch purchasing have been going on over the last five years. The property is now under contract and we have been advised that our staying on is preferred. However, no terms and conditions of occupancy have been discussed as yet."

"We are moving ahead with raising money at this time because our equipment is dated, our horses are aging and opportunities to solidify and expand are at our door step. The campaign funds will position us at the ready when those opportunities arise," Dahn stated.

Meredith Page Etchison of Lexington, KY, died on May 7 at the age of 64. She grew up in Frederick and loved horseback riding and art.


